The Town of Boiling Springs is proud to announce Nathan Phillips as Boiling Springs Police Chief. Phillips has risen through the ranks of the B.S.P.D. over the course of his 16 year career with the department. After the retirement of former Chief Randy Page, Phillips served the department as Interim Chief. Prior to that Phillips spent five years as the Lieutenant over Operations. As part of the department's command staff he managed the training program and fleet, supervised personnel, and took an active role in several projects and initiatives that improved and professionalized the B.S.P.D.

Phillips was instrumental in making the B.S.P.D. a lead agency in the Safe Kids Cleveland County Coalition's Child Passenger Safety Seat Diversion Program. Under this program drivers who receive a citation for an improper or missing child seat can have their citation dismissed after a child seat is properly installed by a certified technician. The B.S.P.D. remains active in the diversion program and continues to advance the proper use of child safety seats.

Phillips is the eleventh person to serve as Police Chief since the Boiling Springs Police Department was started in 1956. During my time as Town Manager, the B.S.P.D. has made incredible steps towards becoming a better equipped and more professional law enforcement agency and I know that this track record will continue under Phillips' leadership. Please join me in welcoming Chief Phillips into his new role at the B.S.P.D.
